Digs
The $O$ A $S$ began its fficial di sing in the sorine of 1951, taking over the Wudbridge (ackenzie) site at the conclusion of the $U$ of $T$ student dig there. In the fall af thet year the 0 A $S$, uncer the supervision of $\mathbb{N}$ Stuckey, dug the Schumberg site.

The Parsons sitc (suuth of Barric) was excavated first by the 0 A $S$, under Pratt, and later by the J of T. Data from this site was used by Dr Ene son in his article "Understending Irvquois Pottery Tyoes" to illustrate hov ceramic remains are used to dorive a chromological and cultural secuenco for sites. Naterial from the dig is inve in the O A S Oshawa lab,

Doncaster - this site, on the $D$ on River, was excavated in the fall Jf 1952 , under the supervision of P Pratt,

The Draper site, morth-cast of Toronto, was dug in the spring of $195 \overline{3}$, under $J V$ Wright, who is now with the National Muscum. Material is in the Ushava lab.

During 1054, 1955, is 1956, three sites in the northeast curner of Metrupulitan Toronto we e excavated: Milroy, Robb, and Fairty. The second Milruy dis was shared with U of $T$, under the supervision of Dr J NEmerson. Waterial is in the $U$ of $T$ labs, with samples of artifacts at our Oshawa lab. A preliminary reourt on tis site, by Bill Donaldson, is in our current Publication $\$ 6$. The Robb site vas excavated under J V Vright. Field motes and material are in the Oshawa lab; a proliminary report, by Bill Donaldson, is in Publication $\frac{\#}{\#} 6$; tho final report is in rough draft. The Fairty Ossuary was oxcavated in the fall Jf 1956; G Ruth warshall supervised. Field notes are at the Osheva lab; matcrial is at U of $T$.

In the fall of 1.954 and soring of 1955 , the $0 \mathrm{~A} S$ supplied supervesory personel for the Jordan Wuseum of the Twenty, to dig the Fletcher site, near Grimsby. waterial is on display in the Jordan Muscum. A report, by ruth warshall, is in Publication 6 .

The Rouge Valley Watershed Survey was begun in the spring of 1956, and continued in the spring of 1959 and 1,61. This surface survey covers an area east and north of Metiopulitan Toronto.

The Buyd site, near Kleinburg, was excavated by the 0 A $S$ in the spring of 1957, with Paul Sweetman in charge. A display of the material has been set up in the Boyd Conservation Area. The preliminary roport, by Paul Swcetman, is in Publication 44 ; the fual report, by Bill Donaldsun, has been prepared for publication. Material is in the Oshava lab.

Spring and fall of 1.960 saw the 0 A $S$ nurth-east of Agincourt, digcine the Elliott site under Frank wee, We returnod in tho spring Jf 1,61 , under Phyllis Bowland and Poul Karrow, to co plete the dig. A preliminary report is in Publication $\mathrm{T}_{6}$, and a final is in draft; both aro by Bill Donaldson. Field nutes and material aro in the Oshawa lab. A display is being prepared for the Agincuurt High Schoul.

The Short site was excavated in the spring and fall of 1961, under Bill Donaldson's supervision. A display has been mounted in the Bowmanville Historical. Musoum. Field notes and material are in the Oshawa lab, and a preliminary report is in Publication \#6.

The OA S has, in addition, assisted at digs by Uf T, the National Museum, and the Royal Ontario Museum, during the period from 1951 to the present.

## Mectings

Our first mecting of this season (oct) was held in the Parrish Hall of St Paul's Church. Our Speaker, Miss Helen Devereux, of Tormato, told us the histury of the Cahiague site, which the University of Turont: uses as a Field Archoological Schoul. A brief resune of her talk is given on page 8 .

For jur second meoting ( $\mathbb{N}$ ) ), we moved into jur new "quarters": the shiny now ArcheslJey Labs in Sydney Smith Hall, the $U$ of Tis new Arts Building. The array of mounted displays around us was a fitting setting for the talk by Mr E R Channen, Curator of the Strathaven Indian Musem, Antomills, ont (near Burrie). Mr Chamen told us how his enthusiasm for archoblogy and the richness of the sites he excavated drew him on int, establishing his museum. He touched only lightly on the labour of claning, cataloguing, and monting his thousancs of items;
but naypne who hes done ony work in this line can anpreciate whatan immense effort it has been. Tho museum is voen to the public during warm weather, and members esvecially are invited t) visit.

Our annual dinner mocting in Doc proved very populer. We were particularly pleased to sec so many jut-of-town members with us. After the banquet, Dr J N kmorson, of the University of Turuntu, tuld us "Archoulugical Anecdotes", revieving incidents that had occurred on sites of intorest to the o A S, during, the past decado.

- wiss Phyllis Bowland, wio continucs as president this year, gave her presidont's repurt for 1961 at the Jan mecting. A delightful differonce to must organizations ${ }^{\text {- }}$ reports, this one was illustrated by Phyllis' own 3-D colom slides, taken at digs and mectings durine the pest yoar.

For the Feb mecting we had two speakers, Mr Morgan Tanplin and ir Don MacLejd, buth of Toronto. Morgan recounted his oxoeriences on Devon Island, in the Arctic, where he hed to fight off musk oxen to get at a pre-Durset site last summor. One of the findings of his party was that beach-levels, which have sometines been used for dating sites, wore invalid in a place like Devon, where block-faulting of the island has altered the pparent sequence.

Don tuld of uncovering 9,000 years of oro-history in the gravel beds of the Fraser Canyon, B C, throideh soil su hard that pick-axes wore the order if the diy. Some of the levels were dated by carbon-14; anothon was deted by traces of the Glacier Peak eruntion of 6700 years ags. Discuveries included dry-masonry structures of prohisturic, and a pit house of histuric times. Buth talks were illustrated by coluur slides.

## Labs

Pottery labs were conducted by Dr J N Imerson in Dec, Jan, and Fob. Members washed and surted raterial from the Bennott site ( $U$ if $\mathbb{I}$ ), practised tcsting puttery for hardnoss, measuring height, diameter, and thickness of cullar, and making technical drawings of pottery shapes and designs.. At me session, we had a seminar in whitch vo attemptod to define the aims of archeology, and to specify individually what we are secking in the study.

Bone lab, with Dr J E Anderson, was held in Jan, and comprised a reviow of the skull and the femur. Dr Anderson alsu reborted completion in the Fuirty Site jsteoligy project (a survey of infracranial skelotons), which will be of great use in population studies.

Project labs were held at the hume of Bill Donaldson in Jan and Feb, at wich members processod material from the Milroy site.

## By Helen Devereux

Thirteon miles west of urillia lies the site believed to have been the Hion village of Cahiague. In 1615 Champlein described it as a large and thriving community; but in 1623 Sagard referred to it in the past tense. Betweon the se dates, apparontly, as is their custom every ten to fifteen years, the Furons moved their village. The Cahiague population, it is suggested, split and resettled olscwhere.

In 1946 Profossor T F MeIlwraith, aseisted by Miss Nargaret Thomoson, cxcavated a portion of the disturbed ossuary at the suath-west end of the site - a 25 -acre expanse of hardwood and upen pasturcland. The $U$ of $T$ s first training schuol was opened here in 1947, under the direction of Dr J N Emerson. About two dozein students oxcavated sidehill dumps al mg the east ravine, as well as middens in the south section of the pasture. Two and a half longh uses were also exposed. In 1061. Dr Emerson organized the secuid U of T training school on the same site. The school had a four-fold jbjective: There had been many requests for archeological assistants, from buth Canadian and American institutions: Cahiague is easily accossible from Toronto and of sufficient size to accomodate a continuing school, to turn out these assisants. Secondly, the Archoological and Historic Sites Board wishod to place an histuric marker in fficial dosignation of the site of Cahiague; additional verification of the location might be forthcoming through excavation. Information from this site can contribute to the study of settlement pattorns. Fourthly, further documentation of the movement and prehistory of the Iroquois could be pruvided.

The 1961. school accummodated 25 to 30 students, who were exposed to the basics of applied archeology, particioating in a sories of daily seminars and actual excavation. Weokly publ. c lectures bo staff members of the $U$ of $T$ were alss .. included in the curriculum. The formal cuurse comprised an intruduction to such various aspects of archeologry as field techniques, human and cmparitive sstejlogv, material. culture, archoological survey, and camp manasement. It is hoped that tho supply of traincd studonts will from now on be able to match the comand.

Discuvery of an area of palisades helped confirm the identity of Cahiague; and last vear the Hon. Lesle Frost, then Promior of Ontario, unveiled an hastoric merker on the spot. It was found that the 1947 Ionghouses 1 ie outside the north section of the palisaded area. A long exploratory trench was dug al.ong tho pasture area in hopes of loceting some of the 200 longhouses repurted by Champlain; but results wero negative.

Artifactual matoriols collected in the dioging will contribute t, the encral picture of Huron history and culture. A moundod maden, entered in the course of the search for the south palisade, produced charred com anc boan kornels, shords, bone and flint fragments. A sequence of discuidal shell beads and one whole ceremic pipe canc to light.

The ussuary proved t, have bcen comoletely decimated in the period since the 1946 excavetion. Within an area of 20 fect on three sidos of the pit, mnly a fow - su fur disurganized oossiblo scaffold molds were cvident. However, thore remained undisturbed ane infent burial, veripheral. to the main oit. Grave goods in this burial i cluded several strines of discuidal. sholl boads, a little cupoer kettlo cutaline smo vegetable and animal remains, and joe copper ladle.
